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# **University of Hull High Performance Computer Steering Group**

#### 1. Terms of Reference

The University of Hull High Performance Computer Steering Group acts as a focussed and user-oriented governance group providing strategic and operational direction for the University HPC service.

#### 1.1 Responsible for (decisions/actions by the group):

- Establishing procedures for the exercise of its responsibilities;
- Regular reporting to the University Research Computing Group;
- Deciding on appropriate levels of HPC resource allocation;
- Deciding on HPC system upgrade desirability;
- Whether faculty or departmental HPC usage should be migrated to the central HPC service with existing equipment decommissioned, centrally supported and maintained. left in situ:
- Development of the University of Hull HPC Strategy;
- Acting as champions for the HPC Service.
- Creating and supporting a HPC Community at the University through the engagement and involvement of users from across the institution;
- Resolving disputes regarding HPC service operation
- Coordination of HPC events (both internally and externally focussed.)
- Collating and validating evidence of HPC usage that will be used to support future HPC related business cases.

#### 1.2 Consulted on:

- Training development proposals;
- Benefits realisation plans;
- Performance management plans;
- HPC procurement activities aligned with the HPC strategy;
- HPC Operational Model
- Service Level Requirements
- Approaches to risk

#### 1.3 Informed on:

- Progress with regard to key performance indicators;
- Activities of the HPC User Forum;

## 2. Scheme of Delegation

2.1 The HPC Steering Group may create working groups.

# 3. Appointment of Members of Working Groups

3.1 Members of Working Groups will be appointed by the HPC Steering Group.

# 4. Mode of Operation

- 4.1 The HPC Steering Group will meet at least four times per academic year. These will be calendared a year in advance.
- 4.2 The quorum of the HPC Steering Group shall be not be less than three with at least 1 of the members coming from the HPC Support team or being a senior member of ICTD staff. Academic membership will come from a minimum of two Faculties and will have no more than one member from the same subject area or discipline.
- 4.3 These terms of reference will be reviewed annually.
- 4.4 Minutes will be distributed to the Research Computing Group and the User Forum. Upon approval they will be published to the HPC intranet site. (Currently on SharePoint)

# 5. Composition

5.1 The HPC Steering Group shall be chaired by the HPC Systems Manager or, in their absence, by the ICTD member of staff in attendance.

#### Ex officio members

HPC Systems Manager.

## **Appointed members**

Six members nominated by the HPC user community.

#### In Attendance:

Secretary: Provided by the HPC Service.

5.2 The HPC Steering Group membership shall be reviewed on an annual basis with the HPC user community voting on nominations at their first meeting within Semester 1.
